tion process, as described by our Assistant Superintendent, Mr. Peter Noonan at the parent meeting held Tuesday, December 5th. Mr. Noonan told us about the hiring process for FCPS Principals.

In brief: Mr. Noonan reviews applications for the position. Using the comments received from our parents and teachers, he narrows the candidates down to a group that will be part of a panel interview on Jan. 4th.

This interview panel is made up of three teachers from our school, three parents and several other

representatives, less than 3 days for the entire process. At the December 5th meeting, we took nominations from the floor for interested parents. As well, an email went out to all committee chairs asking for recommendations. I then compiled a list of nominees for the PTA Executive Committee to vote on. Oak Hill is a diverse school. During the voting, we kept in mind the importance of representing all families at our school. I believe that our panel selections reflect that. Those selected by vote were, Suzanne Keating, Cultural Arts Chair; Angie Fontanillia, Room Parent Chair and

myself. Gerard Eldering was selected as the alternate.

The interview panel is considered a closed door meeting and has a strictly prescribed protocol established by Fairfax County, so we will be limited to what can ask candidates and the information we can give to everyone afterward. Mr. Noonan emphasized the importance of extreme confidentiality with the panel hiring process, so if you



ask, please know we cannot discuss details. But be assured we will do our best to represent Oak Hill families during this process.

Once the panel offers recommendations, those candidates selected have an interview with Mr. Noonan and then with FCPS Superintendent, Mr. Jack Dale. Once this step is complete, the principal selection will be announced. Altogether it is a 2-4 week process, so we should know who our new principal will be sometime in mid-to-late January.

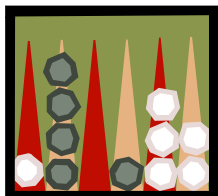

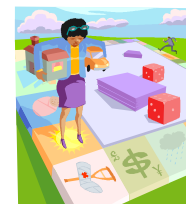

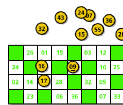

Media News

Is your child involved in a school research project? Do you feel uncomfortable with your child roaming the internet for information? I have the solution for you. The best **online** choice for your child’s information needs, in school and at home, is FCPS Online Databases. When using a subscription online database, students have access to information that has been reviewed and fact-checked. There’s no need to take the time to evaluate the website for accuracy and authority. FCPS subscription databases provide a safer research environment for our

students, with credible, authoritative information, no advertisements, and no problematic links. These subscription databases have been paid for by the county and can be accessed at school or at home. They are ready and available to provide reliable information to students and teachers.

Your child can access these databases through their **Blackboard** account. After logging in, click on the course for Oak Hill Library 2006-2007. From there you’ll find links to valuable library sources including a button for “Online Databases”. To use these exciting re-

sources from home you will need a username and password which is conveniently supplied right there on the Blackboard site. If you have any difficulty accessing your child’s Blackboard account, Tammy Ofano is your contact person at Tammy.Ofano@fcps.edu. If you have any feedback to share regarding the databases, or if you need more information about the FCPS subscription databases, I’d love to hear from you. 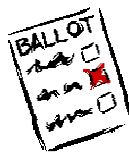
There will definitely be some happy tooting happening in your home if you have a 3rd grader living there.

The PTA allows you to speak for the interest of your children when you cannot be there yourself. Unit executive boards are often confronted with questions as to why their local unit should be concerned about what the District, State, or even National level PTA is doing and what role we have to play in these organizations. You may hear these same questions.

In response you may ask, do you and your children wear seat belts when riding in a vehicle? Does the school serve hot lunches? Have your children been vaccinated against polio? Have you ever attended a parent/teacher conference? If they answer "yes" to even one of these questions, then they had been affected by the advocacy

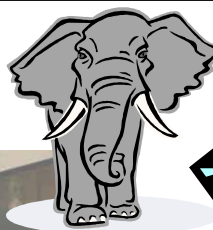

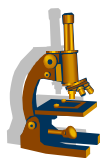
