## Odyssey of the Mind Wins 2nd Place in Division at World Finals

The **Cougars**, the Oak Hill Elementary School Odyssey of the Mind Team A, beat out top-notch schools from around the world last week to earn 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Odyssey of the Mind World Finals at the University of Michigan, May 23-25.

Competing in Division I, Out-of-the-Box Balsa Problem, the Oak Hill **Cougars** placed 2<sup>nd</sup> out of 49 international divisional teams. Their structure held 1,280 lbs, the highest weight among all divisions overall, representing a total of 160 teams.

After winning the VA State championship by 8 points on April 21, the **Cougars** team knew they would have to reinvent themselves in order to be competitive at the World Finals. With only one month to prepare, the **Cougars** took on the challenges to make significant structural modifications, build new props and develop a new skit. While at the World Finals, the **Cougars** discovered a new challenge: the weights used at the competition are significantly different from those they used in practice. They

worked fast and came up with an adaptive weight-placing strategy, which paid-off.

The Odyssey of the Mind World Finals is a spectacular event with more than 800 teams from around the world. Oak Hill's **Cougars**

team was proud to represent Oak Hill Elementary School, the Commonwealth of Virginia and the United States of America at this high-level competition. This once-in-a-lifetime experience taught Oak Hill's students to work as a team and to respect ideas from around the world.
